

It appears that in the Times and Seasons, issue dated March 1, 1842, Joseph Smith, the Prophet, published what has come to be known as the Wentworth LetterDescribing his reasons for producing this document, Joseph Smith explained:"At the request of Mr. John Wentworth, Editor and Proprietor of the Chicago Democrat, I have written the following sketch of the rise, progress, persecution, and faith of the Latter-day Saints, of which I have the honor, under God, of being the founder"

This is a classic text on early church history and I am glad to see it on Kindle but there are some layout issues with artwork overlaying the text. Given the availability of the document, I would hope things like this would be cleaner since this is a paid for edition.

"The Wentworth Letter - Kindle Edition" by Joseph Smith, is just that it's a letter explaining about The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and ending with what is now called "The Articles of Faith."
