** You have to get to know God on a very intimate level in order to have the kind of faith that will withstand the storms life throws at you. It's a good thing that we only have to have the amount of

a mustard seed. Sometimes that's about all I can find. You won't find even that much, though, if you treat him as the enemy or simply a passing acquaintance. Lynette Eason delivers a stellar novel yet again. "Always Watching," the first in her Elite Guardians series, brings an all-women protection agency to Eason's already great stockpile of amazing characters and great series. Wade Savage is a clinical psychologist, radio personality and single dad who just happens to have a stalker. His father brings in the Elite Guardians Bodyguard Agency, led by Olivia Edwards, to protect Wade and his daughter, Amy. As the stalker's action escalates, Olivia and her team are pulled into more and more dangerous situations. Will they identify the stalker before it's too late? And Olivia, always cool and collective in her professional role, just may have a few secrets and fears from her past to overcome. "Always Watching" is a fast-paced romantic thriller, with more emphasis on the thrill than the romance. Just when you think you have the stalker identified, Eason throws in a curveball to get you second-guessing again and again until the very end. She does a great job instilling just enough clues into the plot without totally giving away the bad guy.

Hold on to your hats folks, 'cause you're in for a ride! Lynette Eason's first installment in the Elite Guardians series hits the ground running and barely lets up until you reach the end. Someone has been sending Wade Savage anonymous gifts; and not just random gifts. Gifts that show his admirer has a certain amount of personal knowledge of him. Flattering though it may be, enough is enough. When Wade mentions the gifts on his show, asking the admirer to stop sending them and telling her that he hasn't kept them, suddenly the gifts aren't so harmless anymore. A decapitated teddy bear is delivered to his front door with a note: "You shouldn't have done that. I would have given you everything. Now you'll pay." Instead of deterring his admirer, he's stuck a stick in a hornet's nest. Despite the obvious threat, Wade is determined he will not be driven into hiding – especially if breaking their routines brings on one of his daughter's frequent anxiety attacks. This doesn't make things easy for Olivia Edwards and her team of guardians. As things heat up, conflicting evidence throws the team into confusion. Is Wade's stalker a woman or a man? Or are there two people working together? With each thwarted threat on Wade's life it becomes clear that whoever he, she, or they are, they're much closer to him than an anonymous radio listener. One of the things I loved about this novel was that there were several possibilities as to who the stalker could be. As soon as I began to favour one person over the others, something else would come along to counter my conclusions. I also love that when Eason's characters get into trouble, there's no easy way out; they have to work for it. Olivia was a refreshing character. She's the silent, strong type; dedicated, professional.

It was extremely exciting and kept you at the edge of your seat. I read this book out loud to my husband and he and I enjoyed it immensely. Wade Savage, a popular radio personality and psychiatrist, has a stalker! He gets secret gifts and messages but does not take it seriously. His father Bruce Savage evidently does because he secretly hires the Elite Guardians Bodyguard Agency to protect his son. In the wee hours of the morning when Wade walks out of the radio station after his radio show is finished, he feels eyes watching him. It feels strange and frightening. Madelyn McKay works for Olivia Edwards, part owner of the Elite Guardians; when events start to accelerate out of control. Maddy as everyone calls her was on her shift watching Wade and the radio station but unbeknownst to her someone else was always watching that night too. What I really liked about it was the surprise after surprise about different events that have happened or are happening to Wade Savage. It totally caught me off guard and surprised me with the outcome. My husband thought he had it figured out who the villain was in chapter 10 but he was totally wrong. This was a refreshing change of events compared to most mystery stories that are out on the market today. So many other mysteries allow you to figure who the villain is early in the story and it is confirmed at the end; even so the author Lynette Eason was particularly remarkable in not doing that. There was an innate amount of romance but it did not overwhelm the story. It was just enough to stimulate the romantic side keeping you intrigued as how it would culminate. While reading this book out loud to my husband and we continued to pass ideas about who did it throughout the book.
